Dear David:


As you know, my wife and I ordered a mailbox to be installed at our new residence earlier this week and I sent you a check in the amount of \$281.00± to pay for the work. We have decided this afternoon to go another route and no longer want your services. I am not sure where you are in the fabrication process, how your charges are broken down between manufacture and installation, or even whether you have started working on anything to do with our mailbox. We are certainly happy to pay you for whatever you have done and are hopeful that we have caught you before you are too far along in the process.

I already left Donna of your office a message to this effect, and the purpose of this letter is to reiterate our request that you cease and desist immediately from any further work on our mailbox order.
